

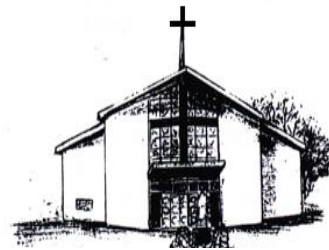

Social Justice Thought for the Week:

Amid the celebrations, *I fear that we are airbrushing one key pillar of this year's NAIDOC call to arms – the Treaty in 'Voice. Treaty. Truth'.* Vague platitudes and convenient obfuscation do no justice to the serious demands of this year's theme and the national conversation it was designed to inspire.

Treaty is not simply some distant fantasyNever forget, the Uluru Statement from the Heart is not just about a Voice to Parliament. It provides a sequenced set of reforms. The Voice is an instrument of Reconciliation, designed to pave a pathway towards truth-telling and agreement-making – to Treaty...

Let us work towards Voice, Truth and yes – Treaty.

Laurie Reedy Collection: The next collection for the fund, which supports refugees and needy families in our local area, will be held July 27/28.

Congratulations to Thomas Duncan who was ordained a priest for the Toowoomba Diocese St Patrick's cathedral on Thursdays evening. His family from Miles and friends from Brisbane and local parishes gathered to pray with and for him.

The 19th July marks 6 years since indefinite detention began on Manus and Nauru.

This indefinite detention is for Asylum seekers who arrived in Australia by boat. The governor of Manus Island province recently called for action from the Australian government after the dramatic increase in self-harm and suicide attempts among people. Seeking asylum in PNG since the Australian election he said. "They don't want to be here and Australia, you have to take responsibility. You have to move them."

On April 17th the former president of Nauru who brokered a deal with the Australian government to re-open the detention centre, said he felt at least partly responsible for the deaths of asylum seekers on Nauru. "I cannot take full responsibility for it, but I do have my share in it when I allowed this deal to be made. I thought I was helping Australia. I thought I was helping the refugees themselves. Eventually it becomes torture when you don't have a future."

Pope Francis: Judge your own heart first – not that of those in need

Vatican City, Jul 14, 2019- Helping a person in need requires compassion toward their situation, Pope Francis said last Sunday, encouraging Catholics to think first about their own hardness of heart, not the sins of others.

"If you go down the street and see a homeless man lying there and you pass by without looking at him, or you think: 'Eh, the effect of wine. He's a drunk,' do not ask yourself if that man is drunk, ask yourself if your heart has hardened, if your heart has become ice," the pope said July 14.

The true "face of love," he continued, is "mercy towards a human life in need. This is how one becomes a true disciple of Jesus."

In his Sunday Angelus address, Pope Francis reflected on the parable of the Good Samaritan, which he called "one of the most beautiful parables of the Gospel."

"This parable has become paradigmatic of the Christian life. It has become the model of how a Christian must act," he said.

According to Pope Francis, the parable shows that having compassion is key. "If you do not feel pity before a needy person, if your heart is not moved, then something is wrong," he warned. "Be careful."

Quoting the Gospel of Luke, Francis said: "'Be merciful, as your Father is merciful.' God, our Father, is merciful, because he has compassion; he is capable of having this compassion, of approaching our pain, our sin, our vices, our miseries."

The pope noted a detail of the parable of the Good Samaritan, which is that the Samaritan was considered an unbeliever. Jesus uses a man of no faith as a model, he said, because this man, in "loving his brother as himself, shows that he loves God with all his heart and with all his strength – the God he did not know!"

"May the Virgin Mary," Francis prayed, "help us to understand and above all to live more and more the unbreakable bond that exists between love for God our Father and concrete and generous love for our brothers, and give us the grace to have compassion and grow in compassion."

After the Angelus, the pope reiterated his desire to be close to the Venezuelan people, who he said are facing trials in the continued crisis in the country.

"We pray the Lord will inspire and enlighten the parties involved, so that they can, as soon as possible, reach an agreement that puts an end to the suffering of the people for the good of the country and the entire region," he said.
