BE NOT AFRAID... I go before you always.

You shall cross the barren desert but you shall not die of thirst

If you pass through raging waters in the sea, you shall not drown.



Many of the rich images that we use in our liturgies, as prayerful reflection, and in music and song have their basis in sacred scripture. Two such images are presented above.

The barren desert, and the raging waters are both images that form part of the lyrics of the familiar hymn, 'Be Not Afraid'. Here in the parish, we drew upon the first of these images, the barren desert, as our Lenten focus.

The second of these images comes to us in today's Gospel, that of the raging water. Jesus calms the windstorm around them, and his followers were left to ponder: "Who then is this whom even wind and sea obey?"

In relation to this Gospel, I read: "In crossing the seas of life, we encounter storms that arise in surprising ways. Lord, may we turn to you for guidance and help at those times and not rely solely on our own resources".

The disciples were afraid and concerned while Jesus was relaxed and asleep. His message was one of peace and calm. May our prayer be that we "wake up from fear and realise the Lord is present ...

... right in the midst of our storms, guaranteeing safety on our journey".

Scripture Readings – Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading – Job 38:1, 8-11

From the heart of the tempest God answered Job: Who pent up the sea behind closed doors when it leapt tumultous out of the womb, when I wrapped it in a robe of mist and made black clouds in swaddling bands; when I marked the bounds it was not to cross and made it fast woth a bolted gate? Come thus far, I said, and no farther: here your proud waves shall break.

The Word of God.

Responsorial Psalm All Respond: Give thanks to our God whose love is everlasting.

Some sailed to the sea in ships to trad on the mighty waters. These have seen deeds of God, the wonders wrought in the deep. [*R*]

For God spoke; summoning the gale, tossing the waves of the sea up to the heaven and back into the deep; their soul melted away in their distress. **[R]**

Then in their need they cried to God, who rescued them from their distress. God stilled the storm to a whisper: all the waves of the sea were hushed. **[R]**

They rejoiced because of the calm and God led them to the haven they desired. Let them give thanks for such *love*, the wonders worked for them. *[R]*

Second Reading – St Paul to the Corinthians 5:14-17

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one has died for all, then all should be dead; and the reason Christ died for us all was so that that the living should live no longer for themselves, but for Christ Jesus, who died and was raised to life for them.

From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know Christ now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here. **The Word of God.**

Gospel – Mark 4:35-41

With the coming of evening, Jesus said to the disciples, 'Let us cross over to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind they took Jesus, just as he was, in the boat; and there were other boats with them. Then it begun to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But Jesus was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke Jesus and said, 'Teacher, do you not care? We are going down!' And Jesus woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be Calm!' And the wind stopped, and all was calm again. Then Jesus said to them, 'Why are you so frightened/ How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.' The Gospel of Jesus Christ.



Pope Francis on Refugees and Migrants

"Having doubts and fears is not a sin... The sin is to allow these fears to determine our responses, to limit our choices, to compromise respect and generosity, to feed hostility and rejection... The sin is to refuse to encounter the other, the different, the neighbour, when this is in fact a privileged opportunity to encounter the Lord ... to overcome our fears so as to encounter the other, to welcome, to know and to acknowledge him or her."

"Even hope, like all good things in this world, has enemies... Hope is the push in the heart of those who leave their home, and sometimes their family and relatives - I am thinking of migrants - to find a better life, with more dignity for themselves and their loved ones... It's also the push in the heart of those who welcome: the desire to encounter, meet, dialogue... hope is the push to share the journey,"

The Queensland Government have released a draft Anti-Discrimination bill, that would be the most restrictive regime in Australia for religious freedoms. It would





significantly restrict the ability of churches, schools and other faith organisations to choose who we employ, as well as introducing other harsh restrictions. The most important thing you can do is to write to your local MP and tell them you are concerned about the bill. Politicians won't know that we care about this unless we tell them.
