McCarthy was a journalist with the ABC and NITV before being elected to the Northern Territory Legislative Assembly as the member for Arnhem in 2005. McCarthy re-entered politics as Labor's Senate candidate in the NT at the 2016 federal election.

Now 54, McCarthy was raised with her mother and families in Borroloola, on the

McArthur River in the NT, and came "south" to go to boarding school in Sydney. She was St Scholastica's school captain. She says she's learned how to navigate two worlds as well as the many cultures within them.

"Where I come from, we have four language groups – the Yanyuwa, the Garrwa, the Marra and the Gudanji peoples – and all my life I've had to navigate through the discourse of those four clan groups and try and keep us focused," she says.

"It's the same thing across the Northern Territory. We've got over 100 Aboriginal languages. I don't know all those languages, so I take interpreters to help me to understand how to navigate through some of the most complex and difficult conversations. I feel that's been my life journey, and I want to bring it to this role."

McCarthy was sworn in at Government House on Monday by the new governor general, Sam Mostyn.



The stories of the prophet Elijah's exploits contained within the Book of Kings are somewhat engaging. They depict him as a powerful 'wonder



That's when God comes to his aid. The opposite was the case with Jesus. Disconcertingly, Jesus' agony in the garden of Gethsemane seemed to prompt no divine assistance. Only when he surrendered himself in self-sacrifice on the cross was his prayer answered in full.

In our own times of darkness and loss, it's a challenge to keep trusting in God's faithful love. Paul learned that when he was weak, then he was strong. We sometimes sing about that at Mass in the hymn, "Give Thanks", with a grateful heart.

In our culture of the 'supreme self', that's rare wisdom. This week we seek prayers on a number of fronts, both in our faith community, the church and in the secular community. You will read of these petitions in our Prayers of the Faithful.

In the Church we conclude Vocations Awareness Week, so we pray for all who may be considering their vocation in life: to the single or married life, to the Priesthood or Religious Life, that they may find fulfillment and the loving support of those closest to them.

This Thursday is the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, one of the remaining Holy Days of Obligation in the Church, that honours the Assumption of Mary into heaven. We will have a special Mass here on Thursday afternoon at 5.30pm.

In the wider community we celebrate Children's Book Week, and so we pray that the activities that happen around Book Week will inspire our young people to a lifelong love of reading. Also, it is Homelessness Week and so we pray for all sleeping rough around our community.

# **Scripture Readings**

### **Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

#### First Reading -1 Kings 19:4-8

Elijah went a day's journey into the desert, until he came to a broom tree and sat beneath it. He prayed for death saying: "This is enough, O LORD! Take my life, for I am no better than my fathers. "He lay down and fell asleep under the broom tree, but then an angel touched him and ordered him to get up and eat. Elijah looked and there at his head was a hearth cake and a jug of water. After he ate and drank,



he lay down again, but the angel of the LORD came back a second time, touched him, and ordered, "Get up and eat, else the journey will be too long for you!"

He got up, ate, and drank; then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb. **The Word of God** 

### Responsorial Psalm: Taste and see the goodness of the Lord.

I will bless the LORD at all times; his praise shall be ever in my mouth. Let my soul glory in the LORD; the lowly will hear me and be glad. (R)

### Second Reading – St Paul to the Ephesians 4:30-5:2

Brothers and sisters: Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were sealed for the day of redemption. All bitterness, fury, anger, shouting, and railing must be removed from you, along with all malice. And be kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ.

So be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and handed himself over for us as a sacrificial offering to God for a fragrant aroma.



### **Gospel – John 6:41-51**

The Jews murmured about Jesus because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven, " and they said, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph? Do we not know his father and mother? Then how can he say, 'I have come down from heaven'?"

Jesus answered and said to them, "Stop murmuring among yourselves. No one can come to me

unless the Father who sent me draw him, and I will raise him on the last day. It is written in the prophets:

They shall all be taught by God. Everyone who listens to my Father and learns from him comes to me. Not that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God; he has seen the Father. Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life.

I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die.

I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

#### POPE FRANCIS



In focusing on the life and example of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, Pope Francis said she believed she was sent "to spread the Good News and invite others to encounter the living Christ." She read the signs of her times, he said, and felt drawn to found several schools to spread the Gospel through Catholic education.

The Pope highlighted her belief that education should promote "the integral development of the person, both as an individual and as a member of the community, which requires

wisdom, patience, and charity on the part of every teacher. May her efforts to form young people inspire us today," he prayed, "and may her intercession sustain the daily work of parents, teachers, catechists, and all educators, carried out for the good of young people and a future that is more humane and full of hope."
