

### Thought for the Week: Season of Creation

Each year from **September 1 to October 4** Catholics join Christians worldwide in celebrating the **Season of Creation**.

The 2024 Season of Creation theme, "To hope and act with Creation," emphasizes the profound relationship between humanity and the natural world. By capitalizing "Creation," the theme acknowledges both the physical universe and the ongoing divine act of creation, highlighting our



The theme calls for active hope and action. It stresses that hope involves more than passive waiting. It requires courage and effort to address environmental and social issues. The emphasis is on collaboration and respect for Creation as a cosmic family, recognizing our role as family caregivers rather than mere users.

Hope is not naive optimism but a dynamic, active process involving endurance and resilience. This hope drives us to strive for justice and positive change, informed by the example of Christ and an understanding that our actions, though sometimes slow to yield visible results, are meaningful and necessary.

Despite all attempts to deny, conceal, gloss over or relativize the issue, the signs of climate change are here and



increasingly evident. No one can ignore the fact that in recent years we have witnessed extreme weather phenomena, frequent periods of unusual heat, drought and other cries of protest on the part of the earth that are only a few palpable expressions of a silent disease that affects everyone. ### A WORD ON TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READING

If we were to hear the usual readings for the 22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday, we would read of Jesus' sweeping condemnation of the Pharisees' legalistic hypocrisy. Living within the spirit of the law, not the letter of the law remains a salutary warning for leaders and believers of all generations.

A reading from the apostle James reminds us that in the hearts of believers the saving word of God has been planted. Heard and obeyed, it directs us to care for the weakest, typified in biblical tradition as orphans, widows and strangers. They are still among us. *Fr Jamie*

### **Scripture Readings**

### Twenty Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary, of the Southern Cross

### First Reading – Isaiah 9:2-7

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness, on them light has shone. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder.

For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.
