

## **Social Justice News**

**Pope appeals for immediate ceasefire in Lebanon, Gaza, Palestine, Israel** -Pope Francis expresses great concern for "the escalation and intensification" of the conflict in the Middle East and appeals for an immediate ceasefire. By Linda Bordoni.

Speaking after Holy Mass in Brussels' *King Baudouin Stadium* at the conclusion of his apostolic visit to Belgium, Pope Francis appealed to all parties involved in the ongoing war in the Middle East "to cease fire immediately in Lebanon, in Gaza, in the rest of Palestine, and in Israel."

"I ask all parties to cease fire immediately in Lebanon, in Gaza, in the rest of Palestine, and in Israel."

"Hostages must be released, and humanitarian aid must be allowed," he said.

The Pope launched his appeal after saying he continues "to follow with pain and great concern the escalation and intensification of the conflict in Lebanon."

"Lebanon is a message," he said, addressing the over 30,000 people present at the Mass, "but at this moment, it is a message that is being torn apart."

The Pope's reiterated appeal came as Israel's military said it struck more Hezbollah targets in Lebanon on Sunday, killing another top Hezbollah leader, a day after the militant group confirmed the death of Hassan Nasrallah, deepening fears of a wider war. Hundreds of people have been killed in the strikes and thousands injured. Israel, which has devastated Gaza in 11 months of relentless bombardment, launched an offensive in Lebanon on Monday after months of deadly border exchanges following the Hamas attack on Israel on 7 October 2023.

"This war, Pope Francis continued, "has devastating effects on the population: Many, too many people continue to die day after day in the Middle East."

And asking for prayers for the victims and for their families and reminding all men and women of goodwill not to forget the suffering Ukraine, he said: "Let us pray for peace."

Marriage and divorce have received ample attention over the years, and the treatment of children in more recent times, so let's turn our attention to the letter to the Hebrews.

Sadly, we never hear its majestic opening verses, except in the rare event of their use in the Day Mass for Christmas. The whole letter is a literary and theological masterpiece in the form of a homily, but it demands familiarity with both Jewish scripture and Greek philosophy.

Today's text from chapter two, the first of seven, introduces some of the letter's major themes: Jesus' unique identity as a mortal human being yet gloriously divine, his saving suffering once and for all, and our solidarity with him on our journey to the Promised Land. Fr Jamie

#### First Reading - Genesis 2:18-24

The Most High God said, 'It is not good that a human being should be alone. I will make a helper.' So, from the soil God fashioned all the wild beasts and all the birds of heaven. These God brought to the human to see what name would be given them. Each one was to bear the name the human would give it. All the cattle, all the birds of heaven and all the wild beasts were named. But no helper suitable for the male human was found. So, God made him fall into a deep sleep, then took a rib and enclosed it in flesh. This rib God built into woman and brought her to man. The man exclaimed: 'This at last is bone from my bones and flesh from my flesh! This is to be called woman, for this was taken from man.' This is why a man leaves his father and mother and becomes joined to woman, and they become one body.

#### Gospel -Mark 10:2-16:

Some Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, 'Is it against the law for a man to divorce his wife?' They were testing him. He answered them, 'What did Moses command you?' 'Moses allowed us' they said, 'to draw up a writ of dismissal and so to divorce.' Then Jesus said to them, 'It was because you were so unteachable that he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation God made them male and female. This is why a man must leave father and mother, and the two become one body.



They are no longer two, therefore, but one body. So then, what God has united, man must not divide.' Back in the house the disciples questioned him again about this, and he said to them, 'The man who divorces his wife and marries another is guilty of adultery against her. And if a woman divorces her husband and marries another, she is guilty of adultery too.' People were bringing little children to him, for him to touch them. The disciples turned them away, but when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. I tell you solemnly, anyone who does not welcome the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.' Then he

put his arms round them, laid his hands on them and gave them his blessing. **The Gospel of the Lord.**
