

The 2024-2025 Social Justice Statement, *Truth & Peace: A Gospel Word in a Violent World*, scrutinizes the signs of our own times in the light of the Gospel, sees the violence and asks why the world is as it is and what is needed for there to be peace. It also asks the question: is peace possible? And in a world where many thin peace is a mirage, the Statement puts its faith in the possibility of peace. In doing so, it looks back to Pacem in Terris and looks also to Pope Francis' Encyclical Letter Fratelli Tutti.



O God, Trinity of love, from the profound communion of your divine life, pour out upon us a torrent of sisterly and brotherly love.

Grant us the love reflected in the actions of Jesus, in his family of Nazareth, and in the early Christian community.

A Weekend Reflection

WHAT IS THE COST?

Among all the hard sayings of Jesus – take up your cross daily, hate your father and mother, give everything away to the poor, to name but a few – the command to love one's enemies is surely one of the most demanding, especially for those who have suffered greatly at the hands of others.

The media confront us constantly with reports of new depravities, new depths of inhumanity. Love and forgiveness appear humanly impossible when evil is SO extreme. The angel's word to Mary – 'nothing is impossible to God' – offers a lifeline.



But that's more likely to help when we've been making forgiveness our daily habit. Every recital of the Lord's Prayer dares us to practise forgiveness for those 'who trespass against us'. Jesus came in order that we be reconciled to the Father and to one another.

In the context of the modern world in which we live, everything seemingly comes with a price tag. A quote that came to us at the time of the death of Queen Elizabeth was 'grief is the price we pay for love'. The cost of following Jesus for some is great. If we are to accept the mission given us, as followers of Jesus we must accept the real possibility that we are being sent out like 'lambs among wolves'! But we must remain steadfast in faith and joyful in hope — especially in this Jubilee Year ...

... and forgive our enemies, as hard as that may be!
