First Sunday of Lent


First Reading – Deuteronomy 26:4-10 (The confession of faith of the elect.)

MOVIES THAT MATTER -

'Shayda' will be screened at 7pm on Thursday 20th March at St James Anglican Parish Hall, Mort & Russell Sts. Light supper afterwards. Flyers in foyer.

Australian drama from 2023 — 118 min

Executive produced by Cate Blanchett, Niasari's movie tells the story of Shayda (Zar AmirEbrahimi), an Iranian immigrant in Melbourne who leaves her abusive husband Hossein. (Osamah Sami) with her daughter Mona (Selina Zahednia) in tow. Shayda finds refuge in a women's shelter where the kindly Joyce (Leah Purcell) protects and guides her through the tough legal process of a custody fight.

It's a tender and revealing film that balances Shayda's discovery of inner strength with the sacrifices she makes for her daughter, as she tries to create a new family for her. It's understated, relatable and drawn from such personal memories that Niasara describes working on it as "long-term exposure therapy".

A Weekend Reflection

DON'T GIVE IN ...

On this First Sunday of Lent, we read of Jesus entering the desert wilderness, where he will be "led by the spirit to be tempted by the devil."

After a period of 40 days of fasting the tempter approaches Jesus with a 'challenge' or a 'dare' – to turn stone to bread. In part, Jesus replies simply, 'One does not live on bread alone.'



The second temptation concerns a test where Jesus would throw himself from the parapet of the temple, knowing that he would be protected by the support of angels. In part, Jesus replies simply, 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.'

The third encounter involves a promise to Jesus of "all the kingdoms of the world in their magnificence", if only he we would prostrate and worship the tempter. The response given by Jesus: 'Get away Satan!' For it is written: "The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve."

During our lives, and particularly in the modern world that we live, we are faced with all manner of temptation. The journey of Lent that began this week gives us a resolve and an encouragement not to give in to the various temptations that come our way on a daily basis.

In our struggles we are given reassurance by the determination of Jesus not to give in to the tempter of the Gospel today. Recalling these stories at the start of Lent is a blessing, and they remind us of our profound solidarity, in faith with all believers around the world.

As an extension of last week's reference to the cleansing of our hearts during Lent, Paul in the Second Reading writes of the word of faith being on our lips and in our heart. Lent challenges us to ensure that God's word truly shapes our lives.
