#### **SOCIAL JUSTICE THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK:**

#### More Water Saving Tips for the Kitchen & Laundry -

- A front-loading washing machine only uses about 64 80 litres of water per wash, 50% less detergent and less energy, which means you save money.
- Change the water level to an appropriate setting for each load of washing.
- Full loads are the go when using your washing machine.
- Washing dishes by hand uses only 18 litres of water.
- Plug the sink when washing dishes by hand, rather than washing under a running tap.
- Soak pots and pans directly after cooking so you don't need a running tap while you scrub them clean.
- Pack the dishwasher completely full before running a load.
- Don't rinse dishes under the tap before loading into your dishwasher.
- Your old dishwasher uses 60 litres per cycle. Upgrade to a new dishwasher which only uses 18 litres per cycle.
- Cook food in as little water as possible. You'll save water and the food will taste better too.
- Fill a small container with water to rinse or peel your fruit/vegetables.

# Learn the truth

A significant portion of chocolate available in Australia is produced using cocoa beans harvested by child labourers, many of whom endure enslavement and exploitative working conditions.

Indulge responsibly, select ethically sourced chocolate, and support companies working towards eliminating slavery from their supply chain this Easter.

#### Here is how:

- 1. Join the one billion people who read the Be Slavery Free Chocolate Scorecard (https://www.chocolatescorecard.com/) last year to discover their chocolate's true origins and evaluate their favourite brands' ethical practices.
- 2. Seek out the Fairtrade and Rainforest Alliance certifications on chocolate packaging.

#### A WORK IN PROGRESS

For those who like their films, books and music to arrive at a clear resolution, Jesus' parables can be annoyingly inconclusive.

Today's is especially so.

We get to the happy outcome of the younger brother's return, only to find there's more to come, and it leads to questions rather than answers. Did the elder brother join in the feast of forgiveness or not? Were all three reconciled? Jesus doesn't give us the satisfaction of a neat ending for us to archive. We're left to stay engaged with the drama, to keep reflecting on how the push and pull of desire, duty, judgment, repentance and mercy are at play in our own lives. We're truly a work in progress until our last breath.


