SOCIAL JUSTICE THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK:

Called to Bring Hope in the Year of Jubilee 'As Australians prepare to vote in the federal election, Catholics have a vital role in shaping our nation's future. Our faith calls us to engage in democracy, to build, in the words of Pope St. John Paul II, "a civilisation of love," and to



contribute "to the good of society in a spirit of truth, justice, solidarity, and freedom." This election coincides with the Holy Year of Jubilee, themed 'Pilgrims of Hope.' Pope Francis reminds us that "all of us have received the gift and task of bringing hope wherever hope has been lost, lives broken, promises unkept, dreams shattered, and hearts overwhelmed by adversity." To bring hope, we must first *become* people of hope; as Pope Benedict XVI declared, "the one who has hope lives differently." The Jubilee reminds us that voting is not just a civic duty but an opportunity to advance the common good and pave the way for hope.

Federal Election 2025 Political discourse in our time has become increasingly polarised. This can, only too easily, foster distrust and erode social cohesion. Unfortunately, in recent months, here in Australia, some have even turned to violence as a means of political expression. We condemn entirely the anti-Semitism that has arisen in our society, as we condemn all forms of hatred or discrimination towards our fellow Australians. Our democracy is defined by our commitment to resolving issues peacefully through dialogue and democratic processes. No politician or political party can ever solve every issue or serve as a perfect representative. Our hearts long for something far greater than this world can offer—something no earthly leader can fully provide. As Catholics, we have an obligation to form our consciences through reason, Sacred Scripture, and Church teachings so that, in the words of St. Paul, we "put on the mind of Christ." Conscience is our inner guide, enabling us to discern right from wrong and judge what is good and just, and we have a duty to follow it faithfully. This demands careful consideration of the facts and the background to our decisions, and a commitment to prayer to discern God's will.'

A Weekend Reflection



Rich traditions. Bold ambitions.

FOR THE PEOPLE

The 'logo' for the Balonne Shire Council that is based around St. George and Dirranbandi carries the simple motto "For the People". The message given to Greater Toowoomba by the Toowoomba Regional Council is "Rich Traditions. Bold Ambitions." This week as we enter Holy Week, the holiest week on the church calendar, we could do well to keep these two mottos close to heart. It was 'for the people' that Jesus both died and rose again. That we, the people, might have life and live it to the full. Pope Francis has encouraged his priests to be close to the people; as their shepherd, to 'take on the smell of the sheep'. Easter is a special time and one for which we have been preparing since Ash Wednesday, and through the sacred liturgy of the Triduum we unite with Christians everywhere.

Many places around the world are unable to gather in the freedom that we do at Easter. We are so fortunate, to simply be able to come together and to share our faith story. That is where the other local government slogan – of the Toowoomba Regional Council – comes into focus.

Our shared journey of faith can be likened to the familiar slogan of: "Rich Traditions and Bold Ambitions!" We draw upon the richness of our tradition to carry us forward. We boldly move forward in joy-filled hope because of what we celebrate in our Easter Liturgies:

- the joyful entry to Jerusalem on Palm Sunday;
- A solemn night of remembering and keeping watch on Holy Thursday;
- The tragedy and destruction of the cross of death on Good Friday;
- The sacred act of 'keeping vigil' on Saturday; that
- Brings us to the joyful resurrection of Easter Sunday morning.

At the culmination of our Lenten journey, followed by the special days of Holy Week, we come to encounter the jubilation of Jesus' triumph over death with the celebration of the resurrection, as recounted in scripture from that first 'Easter Sunday'.

As we conclude our Lenten observances, what special days await us as we walk together – with Jesus – these days of Holy Week. May we do so with a sense of connection to what Jesus encountered 'for the people', upholding the 'rich tradition' of our faith with a 'bold ambition' for the greater good.
