
Weekend Reflection

SHADES OF DARKNESS AND FLASHES OF LIGHT

John masterfully prefaces today's Gospel with three dramatic words, 'It was night'. Much more than a time check, it's a theological statement about Judas' departure into darkness.

The night that Judas has chosen accentuates the glory shining forth from Jesus and bathing the Eleven in light. Jesus bids them show that light to the world by lives of generous, faithful, self-sacrificial love like his.

Clearly, the followers of Jesus have no monopoly on life-giving love. They're often put to shame by the exemplary love shown by non-believers, but the baptised are blessed by Jesus' gift of the new commandment. It's a constant reminder of life's true purpose, a sure guide for each day's myriad choices, and the key to freedom of heart.

SOCIAL JUSTICE THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Quotes to help us get to know Pope Leo XIV:

- 1. "Peace be with you all! Beloved brothers and sisters, this is the first greeting of the Risen Christ, the Good Shepherd who has given his life for the flock of God. I, too, would like this greeting of peace to enter your hearts, reach your families, to all people, wherever they may be, to all peoples, to all the earth. Peace be with you!"
- 2. "We are often preoccupied with teaching doctrine ... but we risk forgetting that our first task is to teach what it means to know Jesus Christ."

- 4. "Our work is to enlarge the tent and to let everyone know they are welcome inside the Church." [...] "God loves us, God loves you all, and evil will not prevail! We are all in God's hands. Therefore, without fear, united hand in hand with God and each other let us go forward."
- 5. "We are disciples of Christ. Christ goes before us. The world needs His light. Humanity needs Him as the bridge to be reached by God and his love. Help us also, and then help each other to build bridges, with dialogue, with encounter, uniting us all to be one people always at peace."
- 6. "We must seek together how to be a missionary Church, a Church that builds bridges, dialogue, always open to receive, like this square, with open arms. Everyone, everyone who needs our charity, our presence, dialogue and love."
- 7. "To all of you, brothers and sisters from Rome, from Italy, from all over the world, we want to be a synodal Church, a church that walks, a church that always seeks peace, that always seeks charity, that always seeks to be close especially to those who suffer."

Winter Shelter Needs Your Help: As the days shorten and the nights grow chilly, we know that Winter is just around the corner. While some of us welcome the cold, we are reminded of the homeless Toowoomba-ites for whom Winter can be very hard. To support those who are homeless, seven different church communities have committed to providing food and shelter each night from 1st June to 31st August. Our Catholic parishes have undertaken to participate by covering each Friday night.

Please consider how you might be able play a part in this **Winter Shelter** project. St Anthony's has promised to provide a meal – pre-dinner nibbles, entrée (eg: soup), main (eg: pasta, stew, casserole), and dessert – on two separate occasions: **Friday 6 June** and **Friday 8 August**. In coming weeks, we will be calling on your generous support (again!) to sign up and provide a dish on one of those nights.

Let's all consider how we can reach out a hand in a very practical way to those who will be doing it tough in the cold of Winter. "I was hungry and you gave me to eat."
