The Ascension of the Lord



Weekend Reflection

We are instructed this weekend by Pope Benedict XVI, who – in his *Regina Caeli* address this Sunday 15 years ago – reflects upon the Ascension: "[the Gospel speaks] of the final departure of Jesus from his disciples...; but it is not an abandonment, because he remains always with them with us but under a new form. St Bernard of Clairvaux explains that Jesus' Ascension into Heaven is accomplished in three steps: 'The first is the glory of the Resurrection; the second is the power to judge; and the third is sitting at the right hand of the Father' (*Sermo de Ascensione Domini*). Such an event is preceded by the blessing of the disciples, whom he prepares to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, in order that salvation is proclaimed everywhere. Jesus himself says to them: 'You are witnesses of these things. And behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you' (see Luke 24: 47, 49).

The Lord draws the gaze of the Apostles [and] our gaze toward Heaven to show how to travel the road of good during earthly life. Nevertheless, he remains within the framework of human history, he is near to each of us and guides our Christian journey: he is the companion of the those persecuted for the faith, he is in the heart of those who are marginalized, he is present in those whom the right to life is denied. We can hear, see and touch our Lord Jesus in the Church, especially through the word and the sacraments. In this regard, I call on children and young people who during this Easter Season are receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation, to remain faithful to the Word of God and to the doctrine learnt, and also to assiduously approach Confession and the Eucharist, conscious of having been chosen and constituted to witness to the Truth. Dear Brothers and Sisters, the Lord opening the way to Heaven, gives us a foretaste of divine life already on this earth." Let us live with anticipation the life of heaven by our patience, gentleness, and love for one another.

SOCIAL JUSTICE THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Reconciliation Week (27 May – 3 June), with the theme *Bridging Now to Next*, calls Australians to be aware that there is still unfinished business on the national agenda when it comes to the due recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians. Fr Frank Brennan SJ reflects on the last few years and asks whether there are any constructive lessons to be learned from the 2023 referendum result which might then help us chart a forward path, building that bridge from now to next. (*Eureka Street*, 22nd May 2025.)



One important way we can Bridge the Gap, is to learn more about our Indigenous brothers and sisters and form relationships with individuals, groups, and Indigenous nations particularly those in our local area - the Giabal and Jarowair people of the Wakka Wakka nation. This can seem to be a difficult task when stepping out alone. Where do I start? How do I meet up with First Nations peoples to hear their stories and practically find ways to Bridge from Now to Next?

In Toowoomba, a new group has formed to find ways to do just that: the **Toowoomba First Nations Allies** (TFNA). This group meets monthly for formal meetings and encourages activities such as book clubs, craft groups, workshops and walking with Indigenous groups on Country. A recent excursion to the Bunya Mountains saw elders lead groups in reflections on the long history of Indigenous gatherings and care for the area over thousands of years.
