Weekend Reflection

THE BREATH OF THE SPIRIT AT PENTECOST



When I was a lot younger there was a hymn that we used to sing at Mass called "The Spirit of God". The opening verse contained these words:

Spirit of God in the clear running water Blowing to greatness the trees on the hill Spirit of God in the finger of morning Fill the Earth, bring it to birth And blow where you will Blow, blow, blow 'til I be But the breath of the Spirit blowing in me.

And now, all these years later, just like that, seemingly by the prompting and by the 'Breath of the Spirit', we have a newly elected Pope in Leo XIV, who has swiftly endorsed his predecessor's legacy. That endowment includes Pope Francis's dedication of the Monday after Pentecost Sunday to Mary, Mother of the Church.

On this Pentecost 'day of mission' and in the face of increasingly divisive populism, it's worth remembering Francis's words in *Fratelli tutti:* 'The Church is a home with open doors, because she is a mother. And in imitation of Mary, the Mother of Jesus, we want to be a Church that serves', a Church that 'leaves home and goes forth from its places of worship, goes forth from its sacristies, in order to accompany life, to sustain hope, to be the sign of unity . . . to build bridges, to break down walls, to sow seeds of reconciliation'.

We pray for the church at large, that it be a loving home where all 'the joys and hopes, griefs and anxieties' of humankind are made welcome ... and shared.

SOCIAL JUSTICE THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Australian bishops have echoed Pope Leo XIV's pleas for peace in Gaza and have called for urgent dialogue and for humanitarian aid to reach those in need.

The Bishops' Commission for Social Justice, Mission and Service have issued a statement expressing concern for Gaza. The statement was signed by commission chair and Townsville bishop, Bishop Tim Harris.

"In the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, we are reminded we belong to one human family which is best nurtured by a world free of war and focused on peace building," the Commission said. "As Pope Leo XIV reminded us, the first words spoken by the risen Christ were: 'Peace be with you all.' The peace of Christ, as the Holy Father stated, is 'a peace that is unarmed and disarming, humble and persevering. A peace that comes from God, the God who loves us all, unconditionally'.

"We join with the Holy Father in expressing our concern about the 'worrying and painful' situation in Gaza. We support his appeal to 'allow the entry of dignified humanitarian aid and to put an end to the hostilities, whose heartbreaking price is paid by the children, elderly, and the sick', as well as the safe return of hostages." The commission encouraged "all people of good will to study the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference's 2024 Social Justice Statement, 'Truth and Peace: A Gospel Word in a Violent World'."

"In that statement, the bishops of Australia sought to offer a Gospel word to all who are committed to speaking the truth and working for peace and unity in a world scarred by violence, especially in Ukraine, the Middle East, Sudan and Myanmar." The bishops offered "three positive steps in building an 'architecture of peace': genuine dialogue, truth-telling and education. But before anything else, we should – as our 2024 Social Justice Statement encouraged – invite God to nurture peace in our hearts and discern how we can share that peace with our troubled world." The statement concludes recalling the words of Pope Francis last year: "Stop! Stop because violence will never bring peace." (Source: ACBC Media Blog)

<u>Peace for Gaza</u>: For those of us in Toowoomba, there will be a Peace for Gaza vigil held at the bottom of Queen's Park on the **first Saturday of the month** from **10am -11am**. We stand publicly in solidarity and silence to draw attention to the pain and suffering of those caught up in this war and to call for peace. Please feel free to join us this **Saturday, 7 June** at **10am**.
