Weekend Reflection

FOR THE FEAST OF THE HOLY TRINITY

"It will not be out of place to consider the ancient tradition, teaching and faith of the Catholic Church, which was revealed by the Lord, proclaimed by the apostles and guarded by the fathers. For upon this faith the Church is built, and if anyone were to lapse from it, he would no longer be a Christian either in fact or in name. We acknowledge the Trinity, holy and perfect, to consist of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. In this Trinity there is no intrusion of any alien element or of anything from outside, nor is the Trinity a blend of creative and created being. It is a wholly creative and energising reality, self-consistent and undivided in its active power, for the Father makes all things through the Word and in the Holy Spirit, and in this way the unity of the holy Trinity is preserved.

Accordingly, in the Church, one God is preached, one God who is above all things and through all things and in all things. God is above all things as Father, for he is principle and source; he is through all things through the Word; and he is in all things in the Holy Spirit... Even the gifts that the Spirit dispenses to individuals are given by the Father through the Word. For all that belongs to the Father belongs also to the Son, and so the graces given by the Son in the Spirit are true gifts of the Father. Similarly, when the Spirit dwells in us, the Word who bestows the Spirit is in us too, and the Father is present in the Word. This is the meaning of the text: *My Father and I will come to him and make our home with him*. For where the light is, there also is the radiance; and where the radiance is, there too are its power and its resplendent grace." (St Athanasius of Alexandria, c.AD 296-373)

SOCIAL JUSTICE THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

World Refugee Week 15-21 June

Australia joins the global community in celebrating Refugee Week culminating in **World Refugee Day on 20 June**. It's a week that does two important things at once: celebrates the incredible contributions refugees make to our communities, and shines a light on the urgent challenges they still face.



Over 120 million people worldwide have been forced to flee their homes. That's more than 1 in 73 people globally who are now forcibly displaced. The conflict in Sudan and Democratic Republic of Congo and ongoing genocide in Palestine are driving some of the world's largest humanitarian crises. Over 4 million people have fled Sudan since the civil war began in 2023. A staggering 23.4 million Congolese suffer from food insecurity making DRC the country most affected by food insecurity in the world.

Here in Australia, thousands of people seeking safety face uncertain futures, policy barriers, and social isolation. But across the country, ordinary Australians are proving that when communities come together, extraordinary change happens. Toowoomba is Queensland's largest refugee settlement location after Brisbane. The most recent refugees come from Syria and Iraq including many Ezidi families. Their Kurdish Kurmanji language is the most common language spoken in Toowoomba after English.

Over the years many volunteers have been involved in TRAMS, Vincent de Paul and other groups that offer support to these families. We are fortunate to have many refugee families as part of our St Anthony's community and they are our dear friends. We see them in our Parish gatherings and especially at mass where we greet each other and offer the sign of peace. Many have overseas family members caught up in conflicts which causes them great distress. Perhaps this week is an opportunity to get to know some of our friends by name and perhaps hear some of the stories of how they came to Australia and St Anthony's.

13 June, Feast Day of Saint Anthony of Padua (1195-1231)
