Weekend Reflection

THE KINGDOM OF GOD IS CLOSE AT HAND

Last Sunday at the end of Mass at Our Lady of Lourdes, I reflected that we were in the middle of nine-day period where we will have been privileged to share in all the Sacraments of the Church, except marriage!

We had: Confirmation here Tuesday, a Funeral (not a 'sacrament') at Surat on Wednesday, Anointing of the Sick at St. Vincent's Hospital on Friday and the usual Reconciliation prior to Mass here on Saturday. We celebrated First Communion here at the Weekend Masses, ten children were baptised at both St. Anthony's and Our Lady of Lourdes last weekend, and then the Ordination of BJ on Thursday and his 'First Mass' on Friday.



Ten days that have proven that the local church is very much alive and well. The sacramental life of the church is considered a visible sign of God's grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the church. We have been told that the sacraments are seen as ways to nourish and to strengthen, to express faith, and to participate in the divine life through our union with Christ.

All this proves that "we are many parts, but just one body and the gifts we have, we've been given to share". The sacramental life of the community here is the gift that unites us with all who have a place at our table. This act of faith is a reminder to us of the commissioning by Jesus in today's Gospel to those who were to go out and proclaim the Kingdom. He says to them: "Whatever town you enter, and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.'" Now, if we only had a wedding ... Father BJ is available!

Social Justice Thought for the week: Honouring 50 Years of NAIDOC - A Legacy of Strength



This year marks a powerful milestone: 50 years of NAIDOC Week, a time dedicated to celebrating the history, culture, and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. What began as a grassroots movement has grown into a national celebration of resilience, identity, and justice.

The 2025 theme, "The Next Generation: Strength, Vision & Legacy," invites us to reflect on the journey so far and the path ahead. For five decades, NAIDOC has amplified Indigenous voices and honoured the strength of communities who have endured and thrived despite centuries of dispossession and injustice. This strength is not just historical – it is living and active in the lives of Elders, families, and young people today. As a Catholic parish, we are called to walk in solidarity with First Nations peoples. Our faith teaches us to seek justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God. This includes acknowledging the truth of our shared history and committing to reconciliation in both word and action. "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." Joshua 1:9

This week, we invite you to begin NAIDOC Month with prayer and reflection. Consider learning more about the origins of NAIDOC, the stories of local Indigenous leaders, or the significance of Country in Aboriginal spirituality. Let us honour the legacy of those who have come before and commit ourselves to building a future grounded in truth, respect, and unity.
