

On Today's Second Reading: CHRIST AMONG YOU - HOPE OF GLORY

Paul's letters, even those written late in his life, are driven by a dynamo of discovery. The shock of his conversion launched him along a lifelong journey of exploration. Always eager to learn more about Christ, he was just as keen to make Christ known.

The mystery, he tells the Colossians, is 'Christ among you, your hope of glory'. Mystery, for Paul, is not a problem to be solved, but an unfailing well of wisdom. Not something fatally obscure, but a living truth whose meaning is inexhaustible.



Paul invites and incites his readers to share in his odyssey of faith. If we stay sheltered in a bay of religious propositions and moral dictates, it's time some 'Pauline' wind drove us out to sea.



Legacy in Action - Stories of Resilience

Legacy is more than memory—it is action. It is the living expression of values passed down through generations. For Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, legacy is found in the stories, songs, and ceremonies that have endured for over 65,000 years. It is also found in the resilience of communities who continue to rise, resist, and renew.

This NAIDOC Week, we honour the legacy of those who have fought for land rights, language revival, and cultural recognition. From the 1967 Referendum to the <u>Uluru Statement from the Heart</u>, these moments are not just historical—they are deeply spiritual acts of hope and healing.

As Catholics, we are called to be people of memory and mission. We remember the injustices of the past not to dwell in guilt, but to act with compassion and courage in the present. We are invited to be part of a legacy that uplifts, restores, and reconciles.

"Let us not grow weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." — Galatians 6:9

This week, take time to learn about a local Indigenous elder or community initiative. Share their story with your family, prayer group, or school. Consider how your own legacy—your choices, your voice, your faith—can contribute to a more just and loving world.
