Weekend Reflection

The Seasons They Are A Changing

Many are saying that it is a long time since they have felt a winter as long and as cold as this one. However, as the days march on, there are glimpses that the weather may be 'on the improve'.

The Ekka is in full swing in Brisbane, surely a sign that warmer weather is on the way, even at the mercy of the dreaded 'westerlies'. Those infamous dry, gusty westerlies that locals love to hate: the "Ekka winds". Every August, a familiar chill sweeps through the southeast, while here in Toowoomba, conversations are slowly turning to another much-anticipated local favourite, the Carnival of Flowers.



That's how it is for us in this part of the world. In the northern hemisphere the days will soon start to become shorter and cooler, proving in some way that we do truly live in a 'topsy turvy' world. The seasons in the northern hemisphere seem to suit better the seasons of the church, with the long days of winter coinciding as they do with the 'dark days of Lent'.

As we know, however, Jesus was master at turning things upside down and inside out! This week's commentary from *Australian Catholics* states something similar: "It takes a vivid, if not unhinged, imagination to associate Jesus with the martial arts, yet he was a master of the art of throwing his listeners off balance". Today's Gospel is a perfect example. He trips us up by insisting emphatically that he came to cause division, not peace.

This is just one of his disconcerting declarations about the priority of discipleship over human relationships. They reflect his own fierce fidelity to the mission that drives him, a mission of blazing fire and great distress. They expose the fault line in the rock of our baptismal commitment. The weak vein of compromise with comfort and security. It's no easy task Jesus has assigned us, to be faithful to our humanity and to him.
