Weekend Reflection

A PLACE AT THE TABLE

Last Sunday night at the Parish Celebration for Fr. BJ's Ordination we sang our parish song – as we have done for many years – that reflects our parish motto of 'a place at the table for all' and is set to the tune of The Seekers' *I Am Australian*. We always strive to have a welcome place at our community table for all who find themselves a spiritual home at St. Anthony's, regardless of whatever background we emerge from. We are all on a journey, a shared journey of faith and discovery. We are all 'equal in the sight of God', we are told. However, societal norms often dictate situations in life differently.



The Gospel has a bit to say about that today: "people will come from the east and the west, and from the north and the south and will recline at table in the kingdom of God". "For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last." The commentary in the Australian Catholics magazine calls the ways of the world 'identity politics', a term often used disparagingly in the rough-and-tumble of today's public discourse.

"But the issue is as age-old as the scriptures. Sometimes God's chosen people were sternly instructed to maintain exclusive boundaries between themselves and foreigners. At other times, prophets proclaimed open vistas of solidarity and inclusion. Christian history records similar swings of the pendulum. Churches have oscillated between closed and porous borders, as have Christianity and other faiths. The issue is played out daily on the world stage, in families and in our individual selves. Ideally, at every level a strong sense of selfhood enables one to forge bonds with the other. It's an on-going dynamic that needs to be fuelled by love, not fear, by hope, not hate". Maybe something for us to think about at this time, from our position of relative peace and security here in Australia.

THE WEEK'S PRAYER FOCUS

We pray for the family of nations, that members will work together, not against one another, in determining how best to respond to the challenge of mass migration.
