Social Justice News

The 2025-2026 Social Justice Statement, *Signs of Hope on the Edge*, calls us to examine how we relate to people who are dealing with mental health issues or who are homeless. Archbishop Timothy Costelloe appeals to us "to befriend our fellow Australians ... to be signs of hope, to be the good news that God's unfailing love embraces everyone."



How do we engage with the homeless and those struggling with mental illness? It's not just about simply giving aid, but about really **noticing** someone and **listening** to their story. That's the harder challenge.

Do we say words that invite, or fear what it might cost? Are our attitudes welcoming, or are we concerned that we will be ripped off? Do we invite people who can't return the favour? Let us take to heart Bishop Costelloe's appeal and ensure that our St Anthony's community is one that is part of an on-going incarnation - making God present by our "being with."

St Anthony's Parish is committed to supporting the rights of everyone to be and feel safe. If you believe anyone is at immediate risk of harm you should phone 000 and report the matter to the police. Other concerns about the safety of children or vulnerable people may be raised with our **Parish Safeguarding Representative**, Nicole Rangiira (0437 382 408), the Diocesan Professional Standards Office ((07) 46381379, 0474565426, or professional Standards@twb.catholic.org.au) or with the Catholic Church's Queensland Professional Standards Office (1800 337 928 or http://psoqld.catholic.net.au).
