Weekend Reflection

In the Gospel our Lord reminds us that the call to be His disciple is a call to radical love, detachment, and singlemindedness. Unburdened by the cares of the world, unchained from sin, free from preoccupations with what is fleeting, we run forward on the path of love. This does not mean that we shirk our responsibilities nor become focused on a future paradise. Quite the opposite: it means accepting all that comes to us in the space of 24 hours and accepting it as an infant accepts gifts from a parent. We do not neglect our duties as mothers, fathers, children, and workers, but we take up these duties and do them in a live-giving way.

That is the mystery of the cross; that pain and suffering, the mundane experiences of work, and the shocking twists of life are not burdens to be suffered passively, but are a means of salvation – a means of the love of God breaking through the nuance, ambiguity, and dark places of the human heart. The cross is thus the way to life, and life to the full! Let us take up our cross – whatever it may be and however many there may seem to be – and walk this journey of fidelity to Christ. In faith and love we keep our eyes fixed on Him, knowing that He leads us to life, refreshment, and peace.
