


## **Social Justice News**

"Spring is here, and the sun is going to shine, and the birds all sing as if they knew."

These lyrics from a 1960s song capture the joy and renewal that the spring season brings. As nature awakens in colour and warmth, we're reminded not only of its beauty but also of our responsibility to care for it.

From September 1 to October 4, Christians worldwide celebrate the Season of Creation - a special time to reflect on our connection to the Earth and renew our commitment to caring for it. Rooted in Catholic Social Teaching, this season reminds us of the importance of human dignity, the common good, and our shared responsibility to protect our planet.



Spring also invites us to look inward. The tradition of spring-cleaning mirrors a deeper spiritual truth. As Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 5:17, "If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!" Just as we open windows to let in fresh air, we're called to open ourselves to God's renewing grace.

In today's world, our lives are often cluttered - not just with possessions, but with distractions and habits shaped by a culture of consumption. As Professor Gary Martin notes, we often mistake accumulation for progress and emotional buying for fulfilment. He challenges us to rethink what we truly need, reminding us that the pursuit of happiness through material goods often leaves us feeling overwhelmed and disconnected. Spring offers a countercultural invitation: to simplify, let go and live with intention.

#### Simple actions for today:

- Reflect: Ask God what needs renewal in your life.
- **Declutter:** Clear one space physical or emotional with purpose.
- **Reconnect:** Reconnect with nature, loved ones and your faith.
- **Recommit:** Restart/prioritise practices that nurture your soul and the Earth.
- Reduce: Step away from distractions and listen for God's voice.
- **Reuse:** Use your gifts time, talents, relationships with love.
- **Recycle:** Offer your past to God, trusting in transformation.

Let the beauty of spring inspire you to release what clutters your heart and home. In a world that urges us to consume more, may we choose to live with purpose, care deeply, and make room for God's grace to grow.
